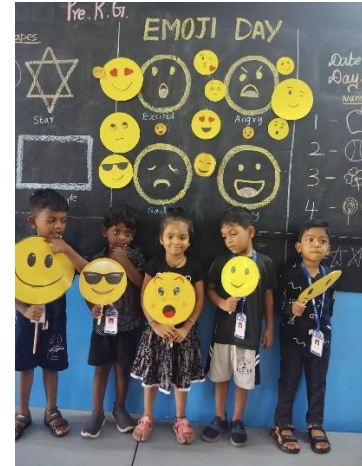
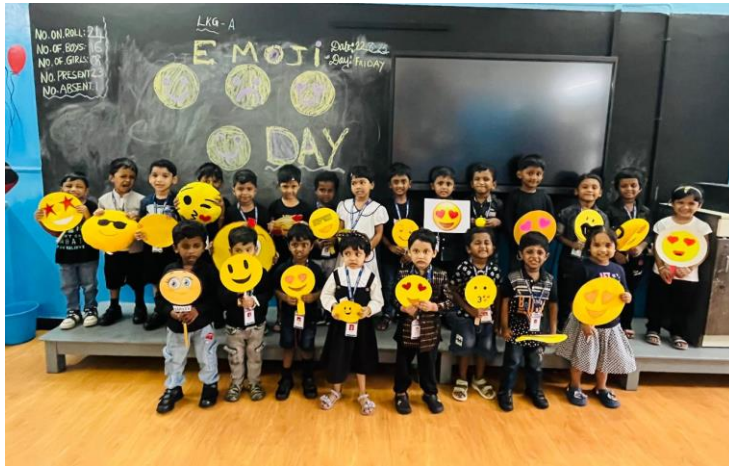
21.08.2025
